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## **Course Description:**

The successful student will acquire the mathematical foundations needed for later computer science classes such as automata theory, formal languages, cryptography, relational database theory, data structures, etc. She will understand and be able to construct proofs, especially those involving discrete structures. She will demonstrate this mastery by solving problems and supplying proofs during class-room discussion and on written instruments such as home work and quizzes. This class directly supports Departmental Learning Outcomes 1A ("demonstrate an understanding of the basic foundations ... of mathematics and statistics ...") and 1C ("display knowledge of the theory of computation and algorithms").

## Grading:

**Exams:** There will be one midterm and a final. The first midterm will cover the first five chapters of the textbook. The final will cover chapters five to ten.

**Homeworks:** There will be five assignments, which will be posted on blackboard. Expect to submit an assignment every Tuesday by 11:59pm, excluding the first Tuesday(06/01/2021). No late homeworks will be accepted because the answers are revealed the next day during recitation.

**Recitation:** Recitations will be held on **Wednesdays 11:40am-1:14pm**. During recitations we will go over the homework that was due during the week, and any other questions students may have.
